Apple Rootstock

M27	Super dwarf – height about 2m. Suits well-drained, fertile soils.
M9	Dwarf – height about 3m. Suits well-drained, fertile soils.
M106	Semi-dwarf. Height 4.5m. Suits most soils with decent drainage.
M116	Semi-dwarf. Height 4.5m. Better able to cope with clay/heavy soil.
M793	Tall - to 6m. Better suited to heavy/clay soils than other rootstocks.

Varieties

Autento dwarf	Early season variety with red blush over green skin. Crisp and tasty when eaten fresh and flavour improves with fridge storage. Good disease resistance .Self fertile .naturally grows to 3m in "Christmas tree" habit. (PVR)
Ballerina Bolero	A dwarf apple that has attractive pink tinged, white spring blossom followed by shining green, early season ripening fruit with white juicy flesh. (PVR)
Ballerina Maypole	World's most compact crab-apple. Stunning columnar shaped tree with masses of large carmine spring flowers followed by large purple-red crab-apples .Ideal for containers or architectural plantings. Very hardy.
Ballerina Polka	Medium sized round fruit with green skin, flushed red. Flesh is crisp and juicy with a very good flavour. Matures mid season.
Ballerina Waltz	Medium to large, round-conical fruit with red skin. Crisp and juicy with slight tang. Good fresh, for drying or cooking. Mid season.
Bisquet (Cider)	Cylindrical fruit with cream flesh , tender and juicy with a bittersweet flavour.

Braeburn. M9	Medium to large fruit with sweet and tangy flavour. Heavy cropper, maturing late March - April. Stores well
Braeburn. M106	Medium to large fruit with sweet and tangy flavour. Heavy cropper, maturing late March - April. Stores well
Bramley M106	Popular English cooking apple with firm, tart flesh yet sweet. Good flavour and plenty of juice. Medium- large sized fruit.
Cox's Orange Pippin M106	Sharp, tangy flavour. Excellent dessert apple. Matures February. Bright striped red over yellow/green skin. Small-medium size.
Fuji	A salad and dessert apple that can be pink striped through to red. Juicy and crisp with low acid sweetness.
Golden Delicious M106	Yellow, with light yellow flesh. Great for eating freshly picked, or in salads and pies. Mild, sweet flavour. Mid season.
Granny Smith M106	Tart and juicy apple for dessert or cooking. April or later. Large crisp, very white flesh. Vigorous upright tree. Good keeper.
Gravenstein M106	Great early apple for dessert or cooking. Medium large fruit, skin green-yellow with orange-red stripes. Crisp flesh, freshly picked.
Harold Red Delicious M106	Crisp white flesh. Dark red stripe over red skin. Matures March. Cooking or dessert.
Hetlina M106	An old apple variety with high levels of beneficial compounds. Early season dessert apple with crisp, red fruit. Disease resistant.
Initial Espalier	An exceptionally good eating early red apple with high aroma, low acid and high sugar. Easy to grow. Already Espaliered for you.
Kentish Fill Basket	Very large pale green apple with red streaks, ripening mid to late season. Excellent for dessert or cooking. Vigorous disease resistant tree.
Kidd's Orange Red M106	Mid season dessert apple, medium to large size. Skin is yellow with blush and stripes. A reliable cropper and reasonable keeper.
Kingston Black (Cider)	Famous English bitter sharp cider apple. Makes distinctively flavoured cider without blending. Small in size with deep purplish skin over yellow orange. Apple keeps well.
Liberty Espalier	Early season apple, crisp, juicy and well-balanced sweet-tart flavour. Heavy bearer. Good disease resistance. Dark red block over green skin.
Little Rascal M9	New KiwiApple. Pink and white blossoms in spring followed by rose red fruit in autumn. Medium sized fruit with white crisp juicy flesh. Sweet flavour. Can be biannual fruitier if fruit is not thinned. Plant with other apples. Height 1.5m
Merton Russet M106	Old English variety, quite acidic at harvest, becoming richer and sweeter in storage. Good keeper. Good disease resistance. Deep yellow flesh with golden russet on skin. Ripens January.
Monty's Surprise M106	A 'medicinal apple' with high levels of beneficial compounds. Crisp, large apples for eating fresh or cooking. April harvest. Sweet and Juicy.
Mother-in-law M106	A less well-known variety of heritage apple for cider making. Sharp flavoured flesh.

Peasgood Nonsuch M9	Old variety with huge apples, good for eating, excellent for cooking. Ripens March. Crisp white flesh with red stripes on green skin.

Royal Gala M9	Sweet and Juicy with bright red skin. Good dessert apple maturing late Feb to March. Good keeper.

Tydemans Late Orange M106	Connoisseur's apple with intense, aromatic flavour and dark red skin, with some russetting. Ripens late season. Vigorous, productive, stores well.
Worcester Pearmain	Early dessert apple, bright red over green. Crisp, juicy and very sweet. Hardy and prolific, little care required.

Fitzroy	Medium sized golden fruit with golden skin. Ripens in February. Consistent and heavy cropper. Self fertile.
Garden Annie Semi Dwarf	Semi-freestone, bright yellow fruit are firm and juicy.
Moorpark	Fruit of good size and great flavour. Dessert, drying or bottling. Ripens late Dec - Jan. Good for cooler areas. Self fertile.

Sundrop	Mid season variety ripening late Dec. Pollinated by Trevatt.
Tomcot	Very large fruit with strong red blush over orange skin. High quality, freestone fruit with intense apricot flavour. Compact tree with masses of pink blossom in spring. Self fertile.
Trevatt	Good sweet flavour with juicy, firm, orange flesh. Pale yellow skin. Med to large Fruit. Can be eaten fresh, dried, jammed or preserved. Ripens early season. Self fertile. Good pollinator for Sundrop.

Avocado

Avocado Hass

Large growing upright tree bearing medium-sized ,oval shaped fruit with thick ,blackish, wrinkled leathery skin and creamy flesh with rich taste. Crops late summer to autumn. Needs a warm spot protected from all but small frosts and free draining soil.

Berry Fruit

Blueberries

Blue Dawn

Rabbiteye. Large, tasty fruit ripening late summer. Pollinate with Tasty Blue or Blue Magic.

Blue Magic

Rabbiteye. Pink tinged creamy white flowers in spring followed by large tasty medium sized berries that ripen over an extended period. Bred for NZ conditions. Pollinate with Tasty Blue.

Dixie

Northern Highbush. Rich, tangy and sweet. Ripens for a long time in mid-season. Pollinate with Bluecrop, Bluejay or Petite Blue

Muffin

Plant in well drained soil rich in organic matter. Mulch well to ensure moisture for shallow root systems. Feed with with slow release fertiliser low in calcium early spring & mid summer. Self fertile.

Tasty Blue

Pink tinged, creamy white flowers in Spring followed by large tasty fruit that ripen over an extended period late Summer. Vigorous bush bred for NZ conditions. Pollinate with Blue Magic.

Brambles

Berry Delight

(Boysenberry x Loganberry) Thornless vigorous climber which produces delicious, large dark red fruit in December/January.Heavy cropper.Very hardy and self fertile.

Blackberry Black Satin

Thornless, late fruiting plant. Needs well drained rich soil. Fruits on last season's wood.

Blackberry Karaka Black

Very black berries over a long season. Resistant to disease.

Blackberry Thornless

Thornless spreading shrub, with clusters of white-pink flowers .Followed by round, red berries which ripen black. Good for freezing, jams and pies. Easily grown and tolerates wet conditions. Plant 2.5m apart. Prune out wood that has fruited.

Boysenberry Brulee

Vigorous semi thornless boysenberry producing heavy yields late season. Large purple/black berry of excellent flavour. Plant in well drained soil rich in organic matter. Self fertile.

Loganberry Waimate	A vigorous thornless loganberry with large fruit size and high yields. Long, conical, dusky red fruit with good flavour, ripening from mid summer. Excellent fresh or for processing.
Orangeberry	Dramatic, fast-growing plant related to the Strawberry. Delicate white flowers in Spring followed by bright orange fruit for Xmas. Best in full sun. Little care needed. Trim edges to maintain desired shape. Self fertile. Hardy.
Rainui Berry	(Blackberry, marionberry cross) Thorny high cropping berry with fruit same size as blackberry. Taste is tangy but very moorish. Crops before Xmas. Used by restaurants in sauce over pork and makes great jam.
Tayberry	Large red fruit. Cross between loganberry and raspberry.
Worcester Berry	(Black Currant, Gooseberry Cross) Prolific dark blushed, gooseberry like fruit, ripening in February. A vigorous shrub with large thorns. Mildew resistant.

Cranberry

Bergman	(Cranberry) Attractive ground cover which produces tasty red berries in mid season. Used for making traditional cranberry sauce and also jelly and juice. Plant in damp, acidic soil with cool roots. Protect from heavy frost.

Currants

Black Magnus	First of the early croppers. Sweet medium sized berry. Fruits mostly on new season's wood. Plant 2m apart.
Red Giant Ruby	Produces huge red fruit about Christmas time ,mostly ripening all at once.Perfect for decorating the pavlova!! Plants are hardy and vigorous.Fruits on 2 year old wood so prune after fruiting or weak branches.

Goji Berry

(Lyceum Barbarum)

Delicious profusely cropping cherry/cranberry-like red berries during spring and summer. Hardy and dry tolerant. Grows well on a trellis or freestanding. Ideal in a patio pot. 1-3m.

Gooseberries (also available in standards)

Invicta	Vigorous bush, large, pale green fruit. Resistant to powdery mildew. Also available in standard
Pax	Mildew resistant variety. Fruit flushed red when ripe. Lovely eaten fresh. Plant is mostly thornless. Also available in standard

Raspberries

Clutha	Nearly thornless commercial producer. Summer fruiting. Prefers deep, well drained fertile soil. Moist soil and full sun.

Haida	A thornless raspberry that produces good numbers of flavoursome dark red fruit. Remove old canes in autumn. Suited to cooler areas.
Lewis	A summer fruiting variety with a very good yield of medium-large, firm, shiny fruit that is easily removed from the canes. Moderately vigorous growth with few spines.
Tulameen	A mid-season, summer fruiting variety producing good yields of firm red fruit. Fruit are easy to remove, are large to very large and have excellent flavour and shelf life.
Waiau	Mid to late season berry with a second crop in autumn. Very large, firm fruit. Vigorous, upright growth. Easy to harvest.

Strawberries

Plant in well drained fertile soil, full sun. Mulch or lay straw to keep fruit clean and off the soil. Plant 30cm apart. Feed with strawberry fertiliser or top-dress fertiliser. Day Neutral means they will set fruit regardless of how long or short the days are.

Camarosa	Rich delicious, sweet fruit over several months. Grows best in warm positions.
Chandler	Medium red fruit with light red flesh. Firm fruit, good flavour.
Lipstick	Excellent ground cover plant for open sunny position. Bright pink flowers in summer followed by juicy red strawberry fruits. Very hardy
Seascape	Rich, delicious, sweet fruit over several months, Thrives in soil rich in organic compost.
Sundae	Large red fruit with excellent flavour. Firm red flesh in an oval shape. December-January Main crop. Short day length.
Sunset	Double-cropping, day neutral, Thrives in soil rich in organic compost.
Temptation	Day neutral. Large, bright red, full flavoured fruit over a long harvest season.

Cherries

Compact Stella	Large, dark red fruit with good flavour. Ripens late Dec - Jan. Self fertile, excellent pollinator. Small, heavy cropping tree. Good home variety
Devon	Small fruiting type of 'sour cherry 'that ripens early. Good for juicing or preserving.
Griotella (tart)	Dwarf weeping habit. Heavy cropping sharp tasting fruit. Ideal for cooking. Self fertile.
Kentish Red	A rich, orange small tart prolific fruit. Freestone used for jams and jellies. Ripens January.
Lapins	Large, dark fruit. Excellent flavour. Self fertile. Ripens early January. Resistant to cracking.

Chestnut

Castanea Sativa 1002	Grafted sweet chestnut. Large tree with excellent grade of fruit. Late fruiting (April). Hardy. Pollinate with 1015.
Castanea Sativa 1005	Big tree with heavy crops of medium to large nuts in early March. Mostly self fertile, but will crop better if planted with 1002.

Citrus

All citrus except Meyer lemons are grafted onto dwarf, frost resistant, quick fruiting rootstock. Meyer lemon is cutting grown. All citrus plants need a warm sunny position in our cooler climates. Meyer lemon is the hardiest and easiest to grow. Citrus should be planted where they can be protected from frost and get the last of the sun every day, preferably against a brick wall.

Grapefruit Golden Special	Med to large fruit, thin skinned, juicy and tangy.
Kumquat Meiwa	Shiny, thin skinned fruit about 2cm across with tart and distinctive flavour. Good for marmalade. Highly ornamental shrub. One of the hardiest citrus. Prefers a prominent sunny position.
Lemon Meyer	Large sweet fruit at early age. Hardy. Good drainage, shelter.
Lemon Meyer Variegated	Fruit like a Meyer lemon, but foliage is variegated.
Lemonade	Lemon-like fruit, juicy with mild grapefruit flavour. Can be eaten fresh from tree.
Lime Bearss	Tahitian lime with small, thin skinned, green fruit turning lime yellow. Tangy and very juicy. Needs warmth and frost protection.
Lime Kaffir	The rind and leaves of this variety are popular in Asian cooking although the bumpy-skinned fruit is inedible. Must have a warm, sunny site with frost protection in the winter.
Mandarin Kawano	Medium sized tree bearing heavy crops of sweet and juicy, easy to peel fruit. Ripens in winter. Needs full sun and warm sheltered position. Protect from frost.
Mandarin Miho	Easy peel, cold hardy with heavy crops of juicy, flavoured seedless fruit. Early to ripen. Suitable for containers.
Mandarin Silver Hill	Variety most suitable to cool climates. Abundant easy peel fruit.
Orange Harwood Late	Average sized, very juicy fruit with a rich flavour. Ripens November to March.
Tangor Ugli	A vigorous, rounded tree with bright green foliage. Good crops of large fruit with a pleasant and distinctive flavour. Matures late spring.

Elderberry

Elderberry	Selected fruiting form. Berries good to eat and make excellent jelly and wine. Ripens April. Fast growing, producing heavy crops.

Feijoa

Anatoki	Exciting new variety with exceptionally sweet ,very early season fruit and large lush deep green foliage. Best planted near another early flowering variety such as Unique or Kaiteri for pollination(Provisional PVR)
Kakariki	An exceptionally early variety ,with very sweet and large fruit. Named after Maori word for green. For best fruiting plant another early fruiting variety such as Kaiteri, Anatoki or Apollo.(Provisional PVR)
Kaiteri	New release .Very early season variety with exceptionally sweet, tasty and large fruit. Partly self fertile but best planted with other variety. Feijoa's have attractive foliage and striking red flowers in summer. Hardy. Needs hot summer for good fruit .(PVR)
Sellowiana	A small tree in our climate requiring a warm sheltered position. Attractive crimson and white flowers. Flowers and fruit edible.
Tagan	A NZ bred feijoa for South Island conditions. A strong upright variety producing large sweet fruit. Great flavour. For best results plant with Tagan 2
Tagan 2	Strong growing variety producing early ripening medium sized fruit. Ideal for hedging. Pollinate with Tagan.
Triumph	Medium to large fruit with good flavour. Can use Mammoth as pollinator. Hardy.
Unique	Small tree producing lots of large fruit. Self fertile and useful as pollinator.
Waingaro	Slightly later flowering variety. The flavour of the fruit intensifies a few days after harvest. Pollinate with Karamea.
Waitui	Early flowering Feijoa producing good sized fruit. Good pollinator for Tagan or Kawatiri.
Wiki Tu	A dwarf, easily managed tree with huge fruit of firm texture. Partly self fertile, better if you plant more than 1 plant.

Sweet Black	A sweet dark skinned fruit with pink flesh and creamy texture. You can eat the whole fruit. Reliable good cropper. Good for cooler summers.

Gevuina Avellana	A striking tree with ornamental berries, then edible nuts. Closely related to the macadamia.

Grape

Albany Surprise	Large, blue-black, aromatic, spicy grape. One of the most popular and reliable outdoor grapes in N.Z. Ripens March.
Iona	Medium sized white grape, tinged red. Ripens February. Very sweet and juicy. Disease resistant and hardy.
Niagara	Sweet, white table grape. Hardy, low seed count. Ripens Feb-Mar.

Schuyler	Large, early fruiting, sweet, black dessert grape. Regular heavy cropper.
Thomson seedless	Famous commercial selection and mainstay of California table grape industry. Large clusters of pale green gold, very sweet, seedless berries. Needs plenty of heat and best with a spray programme. Later ripening.

Guava

Myrtus molinae Sungold	Varigated NZ cranberry with vibrant, golden bronze tinted, young growth that fades. Small white tinted pink flowers in late spring and followed by red edible fruit in summer. Both flowers and fruit scented. Hardy. Prefers well drained sunny or part shade position.
Myrtus Ugni	(Chilean Guava) Slow growing small sized bush with aromatic leaves. Edible fruit, tasty mahogany-red berries.
Myrtus Ugni (Standards)	(Chilean Guava) Slow growing small sized bush with aromatic leaves. Edible fruit, tasty mahogany-red berries

Hazelnut (Corylus)

Avellana	A large many stemmed shrub. Long yellow catkins in late winter. Ripens to sweet edible nuts.
Avellana Alexandra	Medium sized nut of good quality, maturing in March. Does best in cool climate. Good pollinator for Whiteheart, Barcelona and Ennis.
Avellana Barcelona	Large nut with good flavour. Vigorous, heavy cropper. Pollinate with Alexandra or Merveille de Bollwillier.
Avellana campanica	(Italian Selection of hazelnut) Good producer of large nuts with good flavour. Pollinate with Barcelona. Very hardy.
Avellana Merveille de Bollwillier	Old German variety with large nuts. Mostly grown as pollinator.

Kiwifruit

Actinidia Chinensis (Dual)	Male and female in same pot. Deciduous vigorous growing vine which produces fruit in autumn. Requires well drained sunny position and good soil.
Cocktail Kiwifruit (Dual)	February to March harvest of shiny green fruit is smooth skinned and the size of a table grape. When cut open it is identical to the traditional kiwifruit with it's sweet emerald green flesh. Male and female in same pot.
Hayward Female	Vigorous-growing female. Male plant necessary to produce fruit. Can plant more than one female with one male plant. Plant up to 5m apart. Requires full sun and well drained fertile soil.
Chieftan Male	Vigorous growing vine producing edible fruit. Plants of both sexes necessary to produce fruit. Can plant more than 1 female to each male. Plant up to 5m apart.

Loquat

Loquat Thames Pride

Small, soft, juicy yellow to orange coloured fruit, produced in clusters. Harvest when flesh softens and develops a fragrant aroma. Prefers moist, fertile soil and warm sunny position. Tolerates light frost. Eat fresh or use for jam or jelly.

Macadamia

Tmac 214

White blossomed variety that produces large white medium shelled nuts. Foliage prickly and dark green. Requires frost free site and free draining soil. Water well until established and feed with citrus food. Needs another variety for cross pollination.

Medlar

Mespilus Germanica

A picturesque small tree with wide spreading branches. White flowers in summer are followed by edible brown fruit.

Mulberry

Morus alba Pendula

A very striking small weeping tree with closely packed pendula branches. Pale green flowers in late spring followed by sweet edible fruit which are green-white ripening purple. Hardy.

Morus European Black

An attractive fruiting tree. An early maturing variety. Red immature fruit turns to large, elongated sweet black berries. Prefers well drained and moist soils. Disease resistant

Nashi

Hosui/Nijiseiki

Double grafted nashi. Particularly suitable where space is limited as these varieties pollinate each other.

Hosui

Medium sized, rounded fruit with golden russeted skin and highly flavoured juicy flesh. Good pollinator. Pollinate with Kosui, Nijiseiki, or Shinseiki.

Nijiseiki

Large, rounded fruit with smooth, yellow-green skin. Sweet, juicy flesh. Self fertile, but can be helped by planting Kosui or Shinseiki

Nectarine

Peach rootstock – Grows 3-4 metres. All are self-fertile

Fantasia

Late fruiting variety. Large yellow fleshed fruit with good flavour. Freestone.

Flavourzee Dwf

Goldmine

Sweet white fleshed fruit. Skin red flush over green. Ripens Feb. Vigorous, upright and reliable. Self fertile.

Mabel

Unique dark purple foliage tinged with green. Delicious sweet purple-skinned fruit. Ripening mid season and is quite hardy to diseases. Self fertile. PVR

Snow Queen

Early season fruiting with delicious creamy white flesh and deep red skin. Freestone.

Nectarine – Double Grafted

Olives

Barnea	Prolific, upright growth. Medium sized, pointed fruit. Can produce
El Greco	An excellent olive selected for its reliable cropping, medium sized small pit fruit, good oil content and ability to fruit at 5 years of age. A first rate landscape tree.
Frantoio	One of the best Tuscan oils. Smallish fruit, ripening late in season. Vigorous. Self fertile, but pollination improved with Leccino, Picholene.
Leccino	One of the most frost hardy cultivars. Low-acid oil. Self fertile, but
Manzanilla	One of the world's most popular table olives. Small spreading tree. Medium sized fruit used both for oil and table. Pollinate with Barnea or Frantoio. Protect from hard frosts.
Picual	Spanish variety. Early producing, high oil content. Salt tolerant and hardy. Self fertile but can be pollinated by Leccino.
Sourani	Fast growing, hardy variety. High yield of oil. Suggested pollinators Leccino or Picholene.

Passionfruit

Giant Black	Large black delicious fruit produced in February - May. Heavy bearing variety suits a sunny, well-drained site sheltered from heavy frosts. Prune hard annually in Sept/October.

Peach

Normally on Peach Rootstock. Grows 3-4 metres. All are self fertile

April White	Large white fleshed peach. High resistance to leaf curl. Fruits late March. Heavy cropper.
Black Boy	Late peach with purplish red flesh, suitable eating or preserving. Sweet fruit, reliable cropper and resistant to Peach Curl.
Elegant Lady	Med to large fruit with firm orange, yellow flesh and dark red skin. Excellent flavour. Freestone. Matures late January and keeps well. Compact growth Habit.
Flatto Sweet Cap	Flat donut shape, sweet white fleshed fruit. Prefers full sun and sheltered position. Protect from Spring frosts. PVR
Glohaven	A yellow fleshed, red skinned mid season peach.
Golden Queen	Golden skin and flesh. Clingstone. Great for bottling. Ripens March. Excellent flavour.

Kotare Honey Dwarf	Golden flesh with 'lovely' peach scent and delicious taste. Ripens late January. Regular cropper (1m Std)
Red Haven	Firm and yellow with a smooth texture.
Rose Chiffon Dwarf	Tasty and juicy white fleshed peach with pink blossom. Matures late January. (50cm Std)
Wiggins	White juicy flesh with superb flavour. Ripens early season.

Peachcot

A peach-apricot cross. Sweet, tasty late season fruit. Self fertile. Golden yellow skin and flesh. Heavy cropper.

Peacherine

Healeys	Beautiful tasting. Golden crunchy flesh and golden skin with red blush.. Late January. Self fertile.

Doyenne du Comice (DDC)	The 'ice cream pear. Large, juicy, mid season pear. Green/yellow skin with brown blush. Pollinators, William bon Chretien or Winter Nelis
Packham's Triumph	Super all purpose variety with large fruit in mid-season. Heavy and reliable bearer. Pollinators William's Bon Chretien. Crisp, sweet, white flesh with green yellow skin.
Red Bartlett	Dessert or bottling pear with melting flesh. Skin turns bright red when ripe. Sheltered position. Pollinators Conference, Winter Nelis.
Seckel	Small gourmet pear with exceptional flavour with creamy white juicy flesh.
Stark Crimson	Early season, bright red pear. Vigorous tree, good cropper, but short storage life. Pollinators Bon Chretien or Winter Nelis.
Taylor's Gold	A russeted Comice pear, later ripening with excellent flavour. Suggested pollinators Buerre Bosc, Bon Chretien, Winter Cole.
William bon Chretien (WBC)	Sweet pear with smooth greenish yellow skin. Matures February. Heavy cropper. Pollinate with Winter Nelis or Conference.
Winter Cole Dwarf	Late pear, medium size with melting, rich flesh. Prolific fruiter, keeps well. Pollinate with Conference, Winter Nelis, Bon Chretien.

Pinus Pinea Umbrella or Stone Pine. Grows into an attractive, flat topped tree. Hardy. Tolerates dry conditions when established. Edible seeds.

Angeleno	Yellow, sweet firm flesh with purple black skin. Freestone. Good cropper, excellent long storage. Pollinate with Santa Rosa.
Billington	First plum with dark red skin and flesh to ripen. Crops heavily around Xmas. Suggested pollinator Black Doris, Wilsons Early or Omega.
Black Doris	Popular large early plum with dark red flesh and skin. Good for dessert and bottling. Pollinators Billington, Elephant Heart, Santa Rosa.
Burbank	Early to mid season plum with red skin and yellow flesh. Excellent flavour. Self fertile but helped by Elephant Heart, Sultan, Santa Rosa.
Coe's Golden Drop	Large yellow fruit with great flavour. Excellent mid season dessert plum. Needs a good site. Pollinate with Greengage, Reine Claude
Damson	English plum with greenish yellow flesh and blue black skin. Traditional jam and sauce plum. Self fertile.
Duff's Early Jewel	Very early plum with red skin and yellow flesh. Heavy bearer. Self fertile and excellent pollinator for other varieties.

Elephant Heart	Large mid season plum with red flesh and skin. Versatile plum, good for dessert, bottling, freezing. Pollinators, Burbank, Omega.

Fortune	Sweet, aromatic yellow flesh and green skin overlaid with red. Pollinate with Santa Rosa or Billington. Ripens mid January.
Freedom	Large, late season plum. Dark red-purple fruit. Excellent flavour.
Greengage English	Round, yellowish green fruit with rich, tender flesh. Late season. Suggested pollinator Coe's Golden Drop, Angelina Burdett.
Hawera	Red skin and flesh with good flavour. Healthy, compact tree that is a reliable, heavy cropper. Great for home orchards. Self fertile.
Luisa	Large fruit with yellow flesh and skin. Virtually freestone, good eating quality. Self fertile, but better if pollinated with Freedom.
Omega	Late season, large plum. Skin is red/green over red flesh with sweet almond flavour. Pollinate Santa Rosa, Duff's Early, Elephant Heart, Sultan, Billington. Freestone.

Prune Italian	Dark purple skin with light amber flesh. Freestone, rich flavour. Good eating fresh, drying or bottling. Vigorous, cold hardy.
Purple King	Large purple skinned fruit with yellow flesh. Sweet and juicy. Mid season. Pollinate Omega, Elephant Heart or any Cherry Plum.
Reine Claude du Bavay Greengage.	Heavy cropping, succulent, sweet green fruit. Form of English greengage. Self fertile. Ideal for bottling or dessert.
Santa Rosa	Purple skin, yellow flesh tinged pink. Large, firm fruit with tangy flavour. Partly self fertile, or plant with Omega, Duff's Early Jewel, Satsuma.
Satsuma	Mid season, medium sized plum with red flesh and speckled skin. Good for dessert, jam. Suggested pollinator Santa Rosa.
Sultan	Large plum with dark red skin and juicy, highly flavoured red flesh. Heavy cropper. Self fertile.

Dwarf pomegranate with attractive orange-scarlet flowers in summer and autumn followed by miniature ornamental fruit.

Punica Granatum 'Wonderful'

Good ornamental fruiting tree for lawns and borders. Large purplish red fruit with juicy flesh.

Quince

All Self Fertile

Giant of Gascony

Large fruit with good flavour. Early bearer. Self fertile and easy to grow. Good cooker.

Pineapple

Large fruit with white flesh, smooth golden colour and slight pineapple flavour. Good cropper, self fertile. Ripens mid April.

Smyrna *

Excellent variety which ripens mid-April. Large, pale yellow fruit. Makes excellent jelly. Smooth skin. Heavy cropper at young age. Self fertile.

Taihape *

Tender and sweet when cooked. Excellent quality. Ripens mid April. Yellow and smooth. Healthy and disease resistant.

Tamarillo

Bold Gold

Clusters of pink fragrant flowers in Spring followed by large sweet golden fruit. Less acidic than red varieties. Self Fertile. Plant in a warm, sunny position. Protect from frost.

Teds Red

Fast growing tree and produces large, round red fruit with a tangy, acidic flavour. Will fruit within 18 months of planting. Requires full sun and protection from frost and strong winds. Plant with plenty of organic matter.

Walnuts

Meyric

Very fine nut with light colour and smooth shell. Heavy cropper. Grafted variety. Commercial variety, also good for home orchard.

Rex

Excellent flavour. Smaller compact tree. Appears to be resistant to walnut blight. Later flowering. High yields.

Shannon

Top quality, well filled nut. Grafted variety. Appears to be resistant to walnut blight.

Wilson's Wonder

Produces heavy crops of large nuts from an early age. Tried and tested, grafted variety.
